<u>First-tier complaints rule changes should help everyone improve, 30 May 2025</u>

We have launched a consultation on proposed changes to our rules that should help law firms further improve how they define and deal with complaints about their service.

We have imposed our largest-ever fine, nearly £4 million, on Nurul Miah, the former non-solicitor owner of Kingly Solicitors. The firm, originally RH Legal (Bristol) Ltd, was shut down by us in 2020 following serious concerns about the misuse of client funds.
