<u>Extension of fixed recoverable costs - client costs information</u>

Changes to the fixed recoverable costs regime came into effect at the start of the month. You might need to review the costs information you give to clients, including how they might need to cover any shortfall, or



circumstances where they might be responsible for the other side's costs.

Report frozen assets by 10 November [https://qltt.sra.org.uk/news/news/sra-update-121-frozen-assets/]

If you hold frozen assets under the sanctions regime, you must submit a report to OFSI by Friday 10 November 2023. Your report must include details of all funds or economic resources frozen in the UK as well as those overseas, where these funds or economic resources are subject to UK financial sanctions legislation.
